School Characteristics: Concord Academy, formerly cfa Academy, was founded in 1976. One of the largest area private schools in Cabarrus County, Concord Academy has a total enrollment of 800+ students with 246 enrolled in the high school. The school is one of the many ministries of Multiply Church and shares the same facilities. Concord Academy is accredited by the Association of Christian Teachers and Schools (ACTS) and Cognia formerly AdvancED-Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS). The high school curriculum is a college-preparatory curriculum including Saxon, Bob Jones University Press, Glencoe, Prentice Hall, Houghton Mifflin, Summit, Apologia, and Positive Action for Christ.

Mission Statement: It is the mission of Concord Academy to guide our students in achieving educational excellence in a Christian environment and to declare God’s power to the next generation...one student at a time.

Faculty: The faculty members of Concord Academy meet or exceed the minimum requirements for certification by ACTS. The high school faculty consists of two administrators, three part-time counselors, one athletic director, 21 teachers, and 1 para-professional.

Graduation Requirements:

Students must complete 23 units consisting of:

English	4 units
Mathematics (Alg. I required)	4 units
Science(Biology, a Physical Sci. required)	3 units
Social Studies (World, US, Gov/Econ)	3 units
Bible	4 units
Health & PE	1 unit
Computer Science	1 unit
Electives	3 electives

College bound students are expected to also take two years of a foreign language and an additional science.

Grade Point Average and Class Rank:

The grade point average (GPA) and class rank for students is determined by their cumulative weighted grade point average for grades 9-12. Grade point average is calculated by assigning quality points for each letter grade with A-4, B-3, C-2, D-1, and F-0. One extra quality point is added for each honors level course. Two extra quality points are added for each AP and dual enrollment course. The total number of quality points earned is divided by the number of courses attempted to determine the GPA.

Grading Scale:

Starting 2016-2017: 10-point grading scale
 A=90-100, B= 80-89, C= 70-79, D= 60-69, F= 0-59

Prior to 2016-2017: 7-point scale
 A= 93-100, B=85-92, C= 77-84, D= 70-76, F= 0-69

Honors Class Offerings:

The following courses are awarded honors credit: any English, math, science, or social studies course with an honors prefix, Spanish III, Spanish IV, and 4th level of fine arts.

Dual Enrollment classes offered through RCCC, SEU, and SCC. Classes will earn AP quality points for GPA calculations.

Advanced Placement Offerings:

English Literature and Composition, English Language and Composition, Calculus AB, Chemistry, and US History.
 *AP credit is also available for ONLINE classes through the Seven Star Academy. Classes are listed on transcripts with “Seven Star” on course title.
